Male Cell Monitors

1.0 **SUMMARY:**

The Monitor assists detainees as directed by the Officer-in-Charge. All monitors must have received a minimum of eight (8) hours' training in becoming familiar with lockup, restraint and Massachusetts Suicide Law procedures. (33.7.2)

2.0 <u>DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:</u>

- **2.1** Under the direction of the OIC, be responsible in accordance with department procedures and the MGL C 40, s. 36B (Suicide Law) for the well-being and safekeeping of all male detainees.
- **2.2** Communicate all significant information to the OIC through the dispatcher.

MALE CELL MONITORS

- **2.3** To be alert and report, any conduct that may be harmful to the detainee.
- **2.4** To be aware of the proper procedure in notifying the OIC in case of emergencies.
- 2.5 Monitors are not to give anything to the detainee without permission from the OIC.
- **2.6** Monitors are to remain away from the cell doors and avoid any physical contact with the detainee.
- **2.7** Monitors will remain at their post until properly relieved.
